NINE HUNDRED AND FORTY-FIRST AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 86 OF THE REVISED CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF HOLYOKE, MASSACHUSETTS 1997

AN ORDINANCE

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Holyoke as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 86-106 entitled "Permit Parking" of Division 1 entitled "Generally" of Article IV entitled "Stopping, Standing, Parking" of Chapter 86 entitled "Traffic and Vehicles" of the Revised Code of Ordinances of the City of Holyoke, Massachusetts, 1997, as amended, is hereby further amended by the following:

ADDING:

Under 86-106(i)(3) Resident Permit Parking Areas:

Pine St. (between Appleton Street and Essex Street)

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect on the date of passage.
