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IN THE YEAR TWO THOUSAND AND NINETEEN

NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTIETH AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 86 OF THE REVISED CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF HOLYOKE, MASSACHUSETTS 1997

AN ORDINANCE

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Holyoke as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 86-106 entitled "Permit Parking" of Division 1 entitled "Generally" of Article IV entitled "Stopping, Standing, Parking" of Chapter 86 entitled "Traffic and Vehicles" of the Revised Code of Ordinances of the City of Holyoke, Massachusetts, 1997, as amended, is hereby further amended by the following:

ADDING:

Subsection

(j) Designating Resident Parking Only

(1) No resident parking shall be established, except upon petition to the City Council, signed by at least two-thirds (2/3) of the property owners or two-thirds (2/3) of the registered voters within the impacted segment of a proposed resident only parking area. When there are multiple property owners, the signature of one shall be sufficient to count that property towards the required two-third threshold. Said petition shall be referred to the city engineer, along with the name of the street for which the resident only parking area is requested and the boundaries of the intended street segment to be impacted. Each petition will be reviewed by the city council based upon its own merits. For purposes of this section "impacted segment" shall mean 300 feet to either side of the zone proposed by the petition, or to the nearest fully signalized intersection or end of the street in that direction, whichever comes first.

(2) *Public hearing:*

a. Before any order to establish a resident only parking area shall be passed, a written notice of the intention of the city council to establish the resident only parking area shall be given by publication in a local newspaper of general circulation once in each of two successive weeks, the first publication to be not less than 14 days before the day of the hearing and sent by mail, postage prepaid to all property owners within a 300-foot radius of the impacted segment of the street under review for resident only parking and such notice shall specify the time and place for such hearing before the city council.


b. After the hearing has been held, the city council may proceed to act upon an order for the establishment of a resident only parking area.

(3) *Removal*: Resident only parking may be ordered removed by majority vote of the city council only after notice and public hearing in a manner consistent with subsection (j)(2).

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect on the date of passage.
